BACKGROUND

Intimate Partner Violence and Abuse (IPVA) is a prevalent and substantial social issue, with significant harms to the adult victim and, in the context of parenting, to the child. Due to these harms, IPVA is the most frequently identified risk factor in Child in Need Assessments. As such, IPVA is a priority issue that spans both adult and childrens social care.
